Soundings

Every spring and fall, MCWC hosts Soundings, a public reading/workshop event in which, like a whale sounding, participants dive deeply into some aspect of writing. The 2009 spring Soundings presenter will be **Maureen Eppstein**. She will read Friday, March 27, 7:00 pm at Prentice Gallery, Highway 1 at Boice Lane, Fort Bragg. This reading is free and open to the public. On Saturday, March 28, 10:00 am to noon at College of the Redwoods, Room 300, she

will give a workshop titled "Beyond Observation: The Practice of Nature Writing." Fiction, nonfiction and poetry writers are all welcome. Cost of the workshop is \$20.

Maureen has a poetry chapbook, *Quickening*. Another poetry collection is forthcoming from March Street Press. She is currently working on a memoir about her sister, who worked for Maori land rights in Maureen's home country of New Zealand.

This event is supported by Poets & Writers, Inc., through a grant it has received from the James Irvine Foundation.

Carole Boston Weatherford, who will teach the Open Genre workshop at our 2009 conference, garnered Coretta Scott King Honors from the American Library Association at its Mid-Winter Conference for two of her books, both of poetry: *Becoming Billie Holiday* won an author honor and *Before John Was a Jazz Giant: A Song of John Coltrane*, illustrated by Sean Qualls, won an illustrator honor. The ALA Youth Media Awards are widely regarded as the Oscars of children's publishing.

Conference participant **Tom Reed** (2006) credits presenter Dan Imhoff, fellow participant Irene Thomas, and director Charlotte Gullick with help on his recently published book, *The Granite Avatars of Patagonia*.

Another connections story: **Haven Logan** met Steve Mettee, the publisher of her second book *The California Wine Country Diet*, at the 2005 Mendocino Writers Conference. She was a presenter at the conference in 2006.

Larry Baker (2003) will have a new novel coming out this fall (Ice Cube Press), titled *A Good Man*.

Advisory Board member **Valerie Miner** has a Fulbright Fellowship to Indonesia in March and April, 2009. She will give readings, lectures and workshops at twelve universities, colleges and arts centers and also plans to meet with Indonesian writers.
